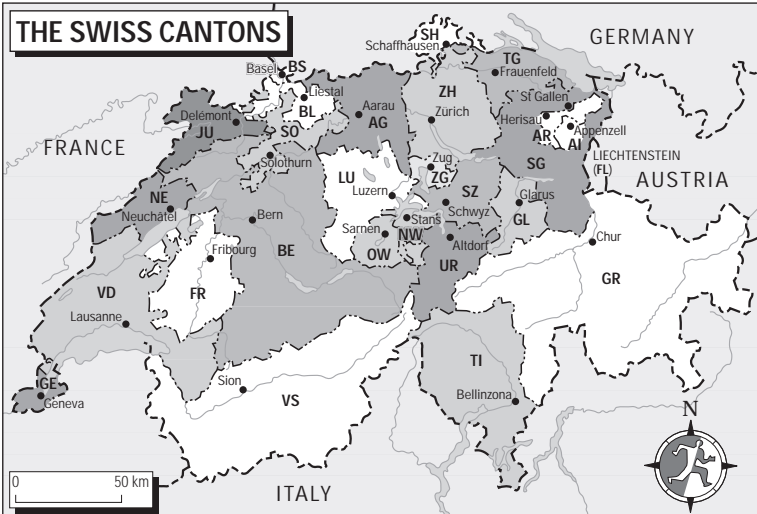


# THE SWISS CANTONS
